Master's direct admission merit scholarships D'Amore McKim School of Business

- $\bullet\,$ MBA and MS applicants are automatically considered for a
- generous scholarship.
- MBA applicants are reviewed holistically, and students with a strong application and GMAT score above 650 will be considered for a scholarship of up to 70% of tuition fees.
- MS degree applications are reviewed holistically, and students with a strong application and GMAT score above 600 will be considered for a scholarship of up to \$15,000.

School of Law

- LLM applicants are automatically considered for a generous scholarship.
- Average awarded amount is 20–40% of tuition.
- A limited number of merit scholarships up to 100% of tuition are available to students who demonstrate academic distinction.

Double Husky loyalty scholarship

• Graduates of Bachelor's Completion programs will automatically receive a 25% tuition discount on 100+ master's degrees.



International Leadership Scholarship

Up to \$16,000 per academic year (deducted from tuition)

- The scholarship is awarded based on academic merit in previous studies, extracurricular activities, and leadership experience.
- Applicants must submit a completed admission application form, with all the required supporting documents, to be automatically considered. Early applicants are considered favorably.
- The initial award is for 1 year, and is renewable as long as the student maintains full-time enrollment and a 2.0 cumulative GPA.
- Eligible students may renew up to 3 times for a total of 4 years.
- For students admitted to a pathway or English program, any scholarship becomes available after progression to a degree.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Scholarship

\$3,000 per year (deducted from tuition)

- All applicants who will earn an IB diploma are eligible
- This award is granted for a total of 4 years as long as the student maintains a 3.0 cumulative GPA.



Undergraduate freshman merit scholarships

New York City campus: \$16,300-\$20,300 per academic year Westchester campus: \$25,500-\$31,000 per academic year

- All direct admission students (joining Year 1 of a bachelor's degree) with SAT or ACT scores are eligible, and will be considered at the time of admission.
- 78% of undergraduate international students received a merit-based scholarship in the fall of 2017.
- Pace University's Merit Scholarship Estimator can be used to calculate the likely scholarship amount based on a student's academic information: pacemerit.studentaidcalculator.com

Undergraduate transfer student merit scholarships \$8,000-\$15,000 per academic year (deducted from tuition)

- Students applying for transfer admission are evaluated on their average grade in high school and university studies.
- An SAT or ACT score is not required.

Graduate merit scholarships

\$1,500-\$6,000 per academic year (deducted from tuition)

- All direct admission students are eligible, and will be considered at the time of admission.
- Students with GPA 3.3+ in their bachelor's degree are most likely to be awarded a scholarship, depending on their chosen master's.

Westchester progression scholarship

\$3,500-\$7,000 per academic year (deducted from tuition)

• Students who successfully complete the Global Pathways program will be eligible for a bachelor's degree tuition fee discount, if they choose to study for at least 2 semesters on Pace University's Westchester campus.



Pathways scholarships
